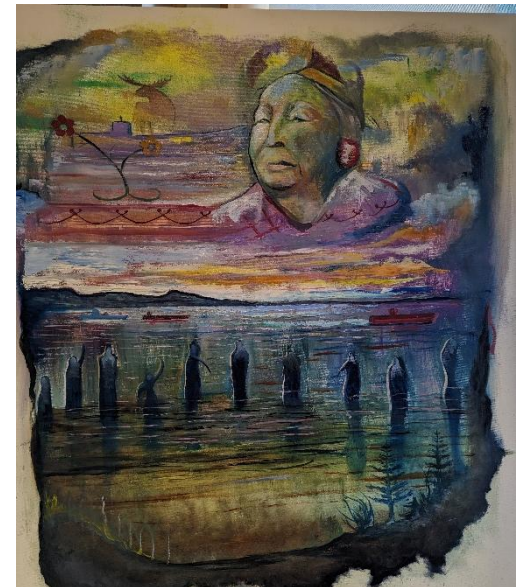
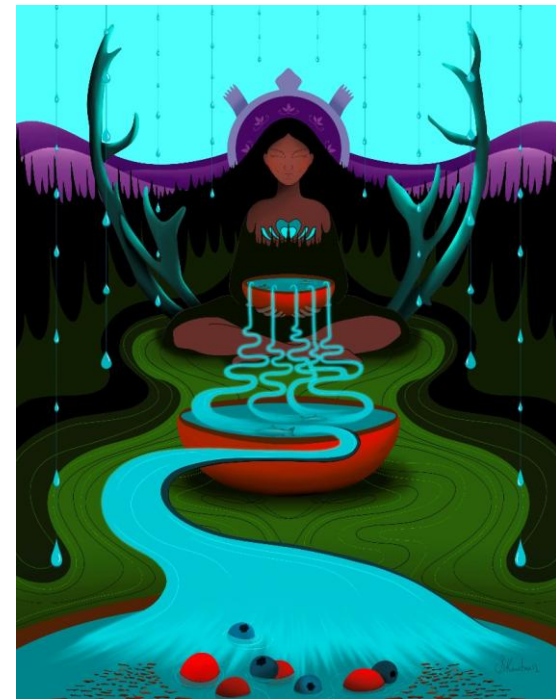
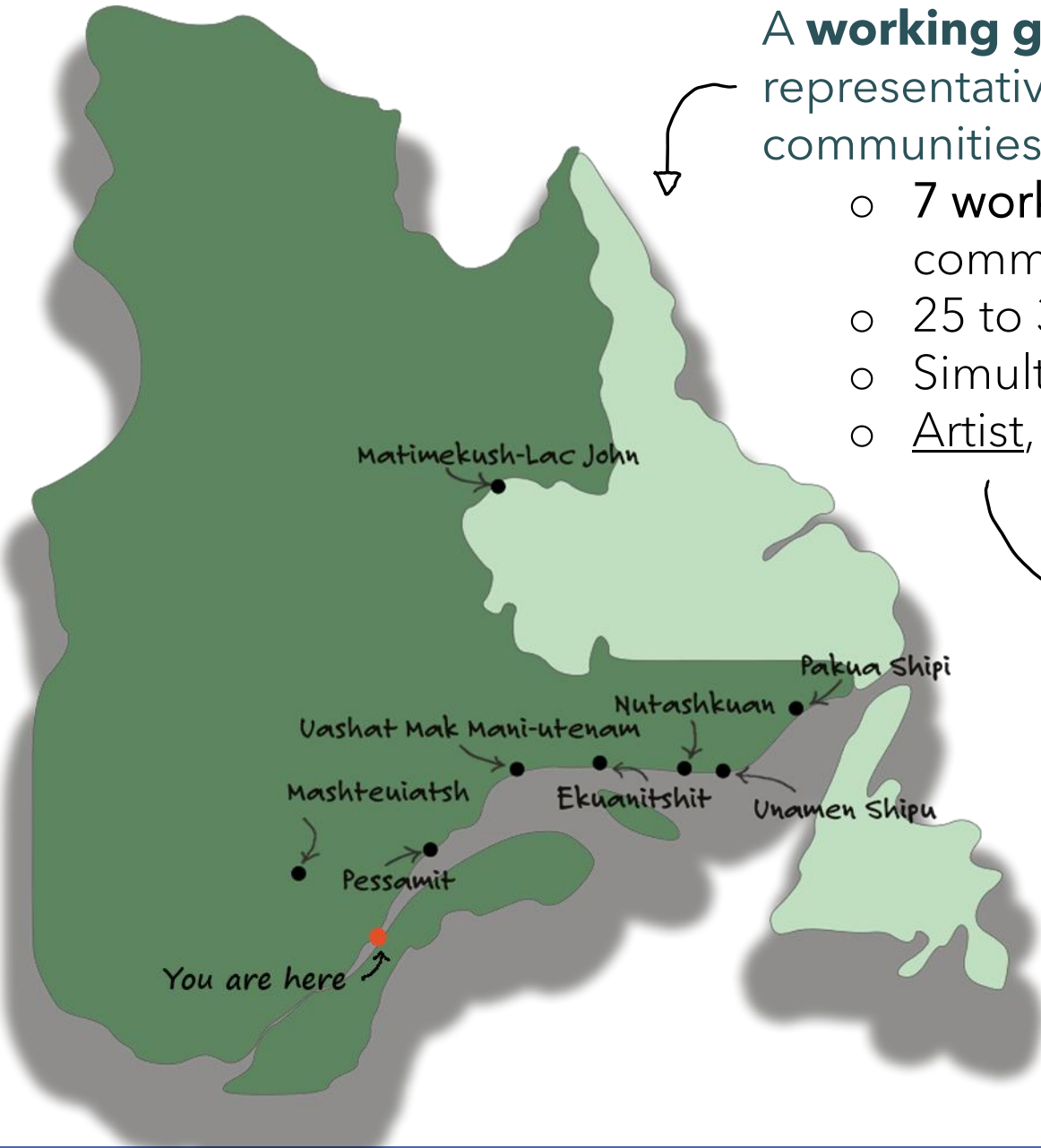
A project under the *Cumulative Effects of Marine Shipping Initiative of Transport Canada (TC)*

- Developed in response to concerns about changes Innu were witnessing in the Saint-Lawrence River, central to their way of life.
- Designed to center Innu needs, priorities, and perspectives

→ How?

A **working group** was formed with representatives and Elders from seven Innu communities

- 7 workshop in person in different communities
- 25 to 30 participants
- Simultaneous translation
- Artist, youth, cultural activities, etc.



Recentering the objectives

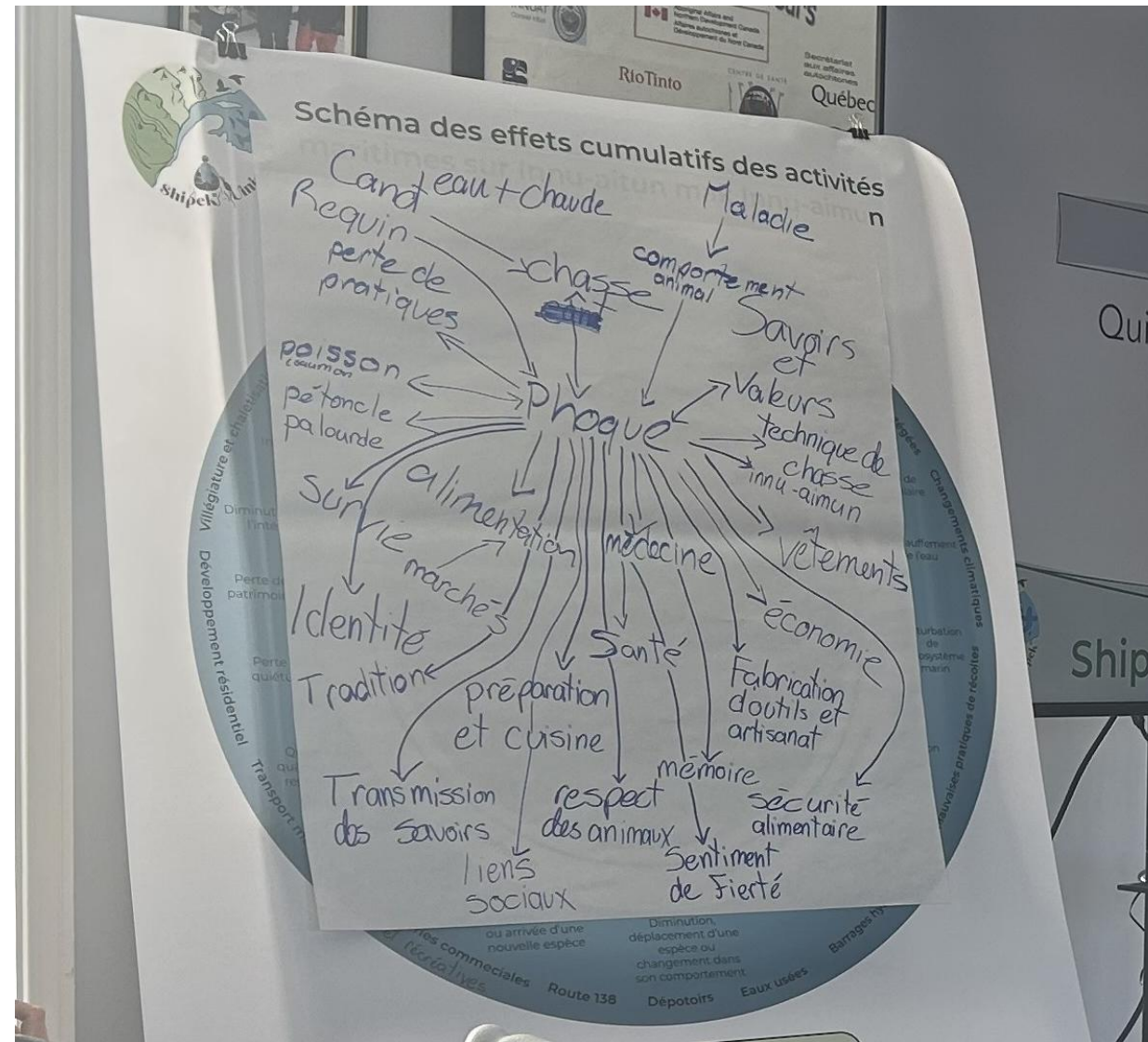
Assessing the cumulative impacts of development along the St. Lawrence River on Innu-aitun and Innu aimun

- Ensure the continuity of Innu-aitun and Innu-aimun in connection with the St. Lawrence River
- Support Innuat in the management of the St. Lawrence River
