An "apocalypse" broadly means **the end of the world, or an event involving massive, catastrophic destruction**. However, its original Greek root, *apokálypsis*, actually means "a revelation" or "an uncovering"—specifically, the disclosure of profound truths or hidden knowledge.  Wikipedia +2

Key Meanings

- **The Original Meaning (Revelation):** In ancient religious and literary contexts, it refers to a genre of writing (like the biblical Book of Revelation) where otherworldly visions are revealed to a human, disclosing spiritual truths or future events.

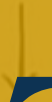

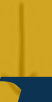

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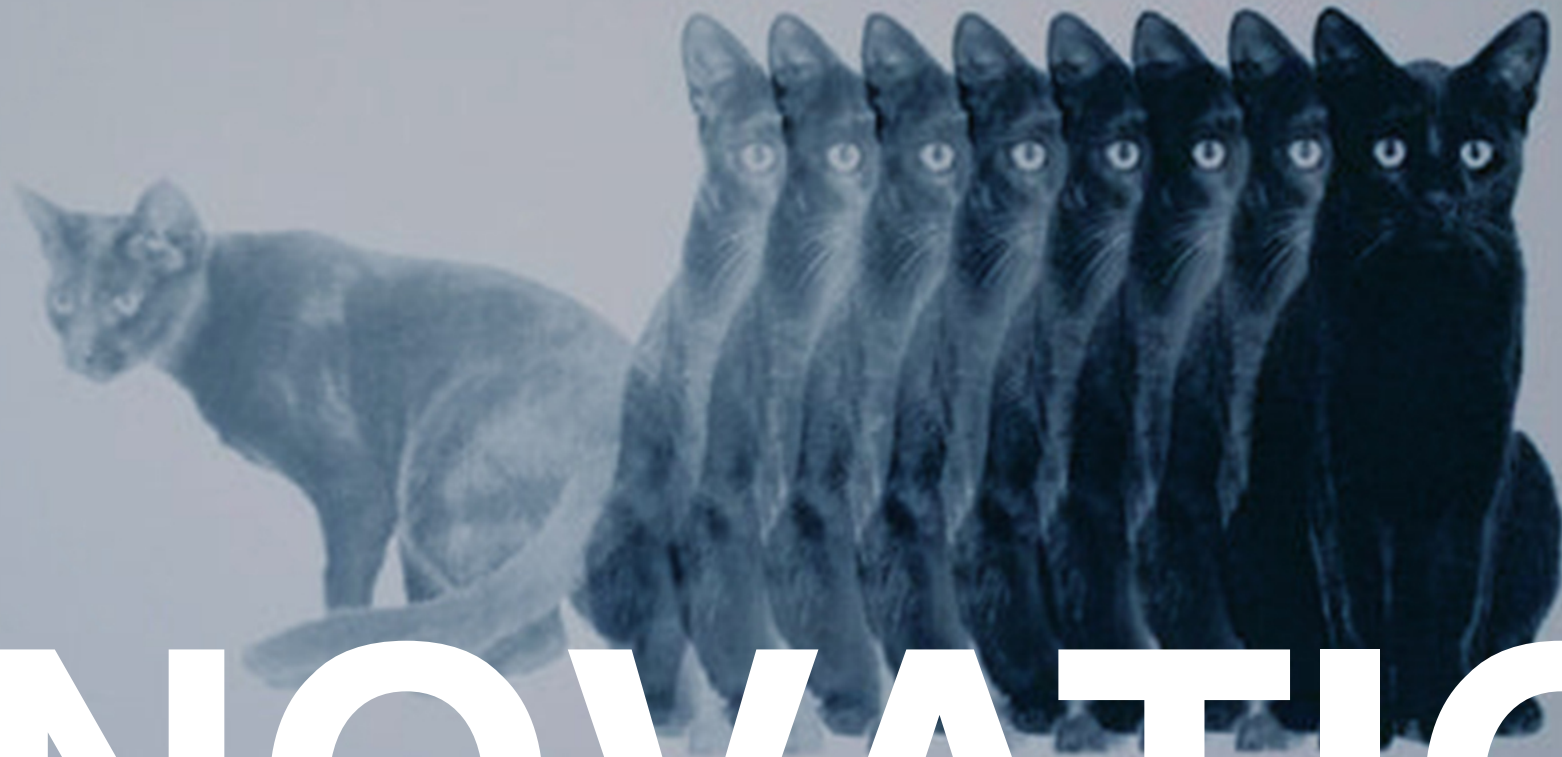

Humanovability® turns impact from a reporting obligation into a measurable, tradable, regenerative asset.

METHOD

Humanovability: 9P×8D matrix

A proprietary taxonomy of **72 indicators** measuring how impact is generated across nine value axes and eight relational dimensions.

Goes beyond ESG: integrates relational, reputational, purpose-related and human-centric layers traditional frameworks omit.

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INFRASTRUCTURE

Black Box - Permitting - Scoring

Enterprise architecture built on Tech VIA (Stanford CESTA lineage).

Extracts structured data from corporate operations, scores it through the 72 indicators matrix, integrates with permitting acceleration platforms already operational at regional scale (in Italy).

MONETIZATION

Tokenized Spheric Materiality Credits

Impact units distributed across a transparent value chain: source, territory, state, non-profit ecosystem (IAIA Italy included), corporate buyer.

Each token is a discrete unit of measured, compensated or mitigated impact — auditable, tradable, governed.

72 Indicators · 9 Value Axes × 8 Relational Dimensions

Each cell defines a specific measurement field — not what a value is, but how it expresses itself across territory, trust, redistribution, traceability, evolution, sustainability, human-centricity, transformative potential.

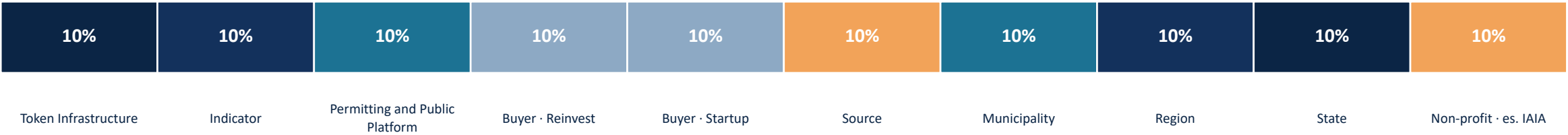

Each token redistributes value across 10 stakeholders — no concentration, full traceability.



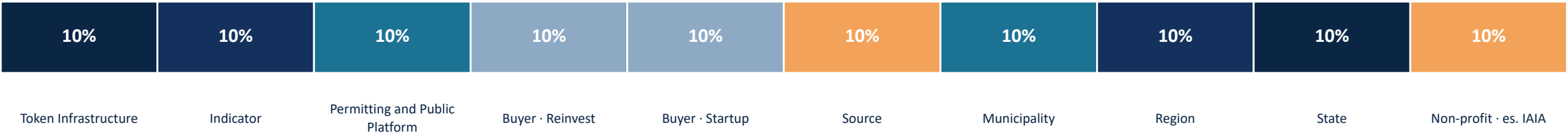
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Why this matters for impact assessment.

Tokenization is not crypto speculation.
It is **the operational endpoint of an assessment process**: the measured impact becomes a discrete, auditable, redistributable unit.
Impact stops being a report. It becomes infrastructure, and the territory that generated it is paid for it.
